Mr. Vikram Labhe is the Vice President & Managing Director of Fivetran India, a SaaS product startup in the data space. Vikram Sir did his MS in Analog Circuits from Simon Fraser University, Canada. He holds one U.S. patent and has several conference papers to his credit. He joined Fivetran as India's founder in 2016 and has played an instrumental role in its growth, culminating in its \$5.6 Million valuation in 2021. He has also served on the board of the India Electronics & Semiconductor Association (IESA) and the Indo-Canadian Business Chamber (ICBC). He is currently a TiE Bangalore Charter member and a Founding Director of the National ESDM (electronic systems design and manufacturing) Technology Research Academy (NETRA) - an initiative through which more than 50 startups are thriving on college campuses. Mr. Vikram caught everyone's attention with his very inspirational journey from an average student at the college to the richest alumnus of the same. He talked about his interest in astrology and shared his vision of creating an AI-powered astrologer. The students had several questions which he answered so insightfully. He helped clear the students' doubts regarding studying abroad, start-ups, and staying motivated during challenging times. It was a privilege to witness the interaction and a truly memorable experience for everyone present.
