
Student Satisfaction Survey (2022-2023)


The summary points extracted from the Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) are:




2. Teacher's preparedness for the classes






4. Teachers' approach to teaching



5 Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers'








8 .Teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitates students' cognitive, social and emotional growth






10. Teachers inform students' about expected competencies, courses outcomes and programme outcomes






12. Teacher illustrate the concepts through examples and applications






14. Teachers are able to identify students' weakness and help them to overcome










